The Eagle Project

The Eagle Project is a public-private partnership where RTD will contract with a team of private partners to Design, Build, Finance Operate, and Maintain (DBFOM), the East Corridor, Gold Line, the Northwest Rail Electrified Segment (a short segment of the Northwest Rail) and a commuter rail maintenance facility as one project. Through this P3, RTD will retain all assets while shifting key risks of providing and operating the project to the private partner. RTD expects to make an award in June 2010 and for the lines to be in service by 2016. RTD estimates the project will create approximately 2,500 jobs per year during the design and construction phase and 300 jobs throughout the operations and maintenance period.

Brian Middleton is a Senior Program Manager with Jacobs based in Denver, Colorado. He has over 30 years professional experience in the rail transportation industry managing planning, design, procurement, and construction of rail vehicles, systems, and turnkey rail programs under conventional and innovative procurement methodologies.

Brian currently serves as the Jacobs' Project Manager for Denver RTD's \$6.5 billion FasTracks program, leading the Project Support Services Consultant team through the planning, design and implementation phases.

Brian also leads the development of the Public Private Partnership project that will deliver key parts of FasTracks including the East corridor, Gold Line, Northwest Rail Electrified Segment and commuter rail maintenance facility. This \$2.3 billion project includes private financing for approximately half of the capital value as well as operations and maintenance services for the duration of the concession, estimated to extend 46 years.

Brian was educated in England, gaining an Electrical and Electronic Engineering degree and an MBA. In England, Brian worked for Alstom, serving as a project manager responsible for both bidding and implementing P3 turnkey projects across the world.
