The Williams Village Residence Hall is the first new student residence hall facility on the University of Colorado – Boulder campus to be built in 30 years. UCB Housing and Dining Services is developing a 500 bed residence hall along with developing a new main site entrance, modifying existing parking areas and utility infrastructure to support build out of subsequent phases. This 130,000 GSF, facility includes student rooms along with social areas, academic and office spaces. Construction budget for this new residence hall was set at \$43.1 million with a total project budget of \$51.5 million. The project will be LEED Gold, but is on track to be LEED Platinum.

This new residence hall is the first building for the Williams Village Master Site Development Plan; the full build-out of which will provide an additional 1136 beds, 1,900 parking spaces, and the resulting support and public spaces.

Thomas Goodhew is a Facilities Planner and Architect with the University of Colorado at Boulder. He has over 25 years architectural experience. After having his own architecture practice for 15 years, Tom joined the UCB Facilities Planning staff 2 ½ years ago. Since joining UCB Planning Design and Construction, Tom has been involved in multiple projects for Housing & Dining Services including the Design/Build projects for Andrews, Smith & Buckingham Halls. Tom is also involved in other university projects including the Basketball/Volleyball Practice facility, Institute for Behavioral Science and the Norlin Library Commons development.

Tom is a registered architect in Colorado with an Environmental Design degree from Ball State University in Indiana and a Masters Degree in Architecture from the University of Colorado – Denver.

**Katherine A. Dunklau**, Design & Construction, Project Manager

Katherine is a Project Manager and project management supervisor with the University of Colorado at Boulder (CU). Though she has only been with CU for one year, she previously worked 8 ½ years as Project Manager in Facilities Planning and Capital Projects for California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo (Cal Poly). At Cal Poly, her project included a variety of project delivery types, including the first CM-at-Risk project for the California State University system – a \$34M new engineering building.

Katherine's participation on the Williams Village Ila project included assistance in RFQ/RFP and D/B technical criteria preparation and sitting on the RFQ evaluation team. The project is now administered by Housing's project manager, Heidi Roge.

Katherine has a degree in Construction Management from Cal Poly, and course credits towards a Master in Architecture from Cal Poly.
